Rehearsals are underway for *The Gin Game*, winner of the 1978 Pulitizer Prize for Drama. Linda Talluto, director, is clearly excited about her cast, Kathleen Silloway and Marc Berezin.

Expanding on her cast, Linda told Virginia Kincaid and *Tigard Life*, "Working with these two actors is a constant source of joy and discovery, as they bring a wealth of experience to their roles. Each rehearsal reveals a new depth of character development.

The story and characters are complex, and at times, uncomfortable. Yet, as we explore the depths of their life experiences, we better understand the hurt and anger they feel. This is a riveting drama from which I hope our audiences learn, leaving with a better understanding of the complexities of old age."



The Gin Game, which originally starred Jessica Tandy and Hume Cronyn and was later revived with Julie Harris and Charles Durning, uses a card game as a metaphor for life. Weller Martin is playing solitaire on the porch of a seedy nursing home. Enter Fonsia Dorsey, a prim, self-righteous lady. They discover they both dislike the home and enjoy gin rummy, so they begin to play and to reveal intimate details of their lives. Fonsia wins every time, and their secrets become weapons used against one another. Weller longs for a victory to counter a lifetime of defeats, but it doesn't happen. He leaves the stage a broken man, and Fonsia realizes her self-righteous rigidity has led to an embittered, lonely, old age.

The show runs from July 14 to July 30 (Fridays and Saturdays at 7:30pm, Sundays at 3:00pm) at the Tualatin Heritage Center, 8700 SW Sweek in Tualatin. <u>Tickets are on sale now.</u>

Please note that this show has some strong language and anger expressed by the characters, and it could cause discomfort with some audience members.





Volunteer Spotlight is on ... Cindy Zimmerman

If you notice how the sets at *Mask & Mirror* have interesting details, like plants, pictures and special finishes that make the stage look convincing, that's because of Cindy. She is the magician who dresses our sets and makes them special.

She grew up in Lake Oswego with a younger sister and brother, in what she calls an "all American" family. As a child, she loved to dance and started lessons at age five, which she continued until she graduated from Lake O high school. Speaking of all American, she was a cheer leader and captain of the Dance Team. Her other passion was designing clothes. Her one acting experience was as a teen, starring as "Alice" in the ballet of Alice in Wonderland. She confesses that her sister is still madshe was a rosebush!

Cindy attended Oregon State, where she met her husband, Dave, and graduated with a degree in Interior Design and a minor in fashion. Her first job was Home Fashions Coordinator for Sears in Washington Square. She describes it as a dream job because she got to do all of the displays for the home, including setting the rooms for the furniture department (perfect training for dressing our sets!) Eventually she became an "actual interior designer" at Northwest Interiors. Then came kids, a poor economy and a lot of volunteer work, such as decorations chair for school auctions and Tualatin High's Grad Night for many years.

One day a friend told her that the perfect job was waiting for her at *Mask & Mirror*. The play was *The Importance of Being Earnest*. She had found her calling and the rest is history. She keeps a store full of set pieces in a big old barn on the property of her husband's landscaping business. She still gets a thrill when it all comes together and loves getting feedback from actors and audience members.
