



When director Linda Talluto called Kathleen Silloway and Marc Berezin to tell them they had been cast in *THE GIN GAME*, "they were both so excited, they each drove over (to Linda's house) to pick up their scripts."



Marc added "I'm pretty stoked about this and can't wait to get started."

Marc Berezin (Weller) is a retired educator and transplant from Alaska, where he spent 40 years involved in countless plays and musicals such as Groucho, The Wiz, Tevye, Fagin, Mr. Mushnik, and Einstein. Since leaping into the larger PDX pond, he's been fortunate to be cast in several plays and musicals. When not performing, he spends his time enjoying his grandchildren, playing golf, and being 97% retired from his latest career as a database developer. Since entering the ranks of senior citizens, he's been hoping to one day play Weller, as he loves *THE GIN GAME*, and he's thrilled to finally get to do so.

Kathleen Silloway (Fonsia) is delighted to get another chance to bring Fonsia to life, having previously played her at the *Gallery Theater*. She has appeared around the Portland area in roles that include Claudia McFadden (*SUITE SURRENDER*), Marilyn

Dunne (*RIPCORD*), Lillian Troy (*I HATE HAMLET*), Florence Unger (*THE ODD COUPLE--FEMALE VERSION*), and Sister Aloysius (*DOUBT*). She keeps sane by walking, weaving (as part of *Silloway Weaving Studio*), and traveling. She's looking forward to playing many hands of gin throughout the next few weeks.


THE GIN GAME, the winner of the 1978 Pulitzer Prize for Drama, which originally starred Jessica Tandy and Hume Cronyn and was later revived with Julie Harris and Charles Durning, uses a card game as a metaphor for life. Weller Martin is playing solitaire on the porch of a seedy nursing home. Enter Fonsia Dorsey, a prim, self-righteous lady. They discover they both dislike the home and enjoy gin rummy, so they begin to play and to reveal intimate details of their lives. Fonsia wins every time, and their secrets become weapons used against one another. Weller longs for a victory to counter a lifetime of defeats, but it doesn't happen. He leaves the stage a broken man, and Fonsia realizes her self-righteous rigidity has led to an embittered, lonely, old age.

From the President's Desk By Rick Hoover









June's "Member in Good Standing" The Spotlight shines on George Mauro

A recent transplant to both Oregon and *Mask & Mirror*, George Mauro immediately threw himself into the mix, proving himself a tech wizard, and has run lights and sound on multiple shows in his brief tenure. What people don't necessarily realize is that George is also an accomplished actor with an impressive resume and would love to return onstage.

Born in NYC, the oldest of ten children (!), he grew up just north of the city on the Hudson River. As a kid, he played multiple musical instruments, including trumpet, flute, violin and cello. At around age 13, he claims to have discovered girls and thus gravitated to rock and roll bands, playing guitar and electric bass. In college, it was orchestra, jazz bands and a wedding band that played special occasions and club gigs during school breaks. Suffice it to say, George is a highly skilled musician, who became involved with theater in an indirect way.



In college, he was playing in the orchestra for the Drama Department when a friend eventually suggested he audition. He did and got the lead! From then on he was steadily involved with theater in one way or another.

After obtaining a degree in television production, George joined a touring band, *The Classic IV*, who had a string of hits in the 60's. The band broke up (as bands do) halfway through the tour and he remained in FL, trying to make it as a musician. When the struggle became untenable, he decided to put his degree to use and landed a job producing a local television show based on the glossy *Gulfshore Life Magazine*. That launched his lengthy career in television, which eventually morphed into graphics and editing.

He was always involved in theater in one way or another. While in the Bay area, he continued his work in a local theater and met his wife, Lennon, who is also no stranger to *M & M*. She directed the highly successful *LAUNDRY AND BOURBON / LONE STAR* in July, 2022.

Some of George's favorite roles have included Tevye in *FIDDLER ON THE ROOF* (yes, he sings!) and Fred in *KISS ME KATE*. Dramatically, he has brought to life Willy Loman in *DEATH OF A SALESMAN* and Henry Drummond, in *INHERIT THE WIND*.

A huge thanks to George for all he has done for *M & M* in a short time and a tap on the shoulder to all directors: this multi-talented guy is ready for his Oregon stage debut!
