
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The Game's Afoot opens THIS weekend Advance ticket sales have been strong – get yours now!



Here's what you need to know: Audition dates are at The Rise Church, Sunday and Monday, November 26 and 27 at 7:00pm. Callbacks, if needed on Thursday, November 30th at 7:00pm

Rise Church is located at 10445 SW Canterbury Lane in Tigard. Aaron tells us "We will be in the 'middle school room' - use east side entrance, look for signs when you arrive."

Rehearsals are set to begin Thursday, January 3rd (First Read), running Sunday through Thursday, no Tuesdays. All rehearsals are scheduled to take place at Rise Church.

Asked to describe what about this play resonated with him, director Aaron Morrow had this to say: "First staged in 1955, the classic *Inherit the Wind*, by Jerome Lawrence and Robert E. Lee, entranced audiences with its dramatization of the Scope Monkey Trials, the monumental battle between the ideas of Creationism and Evolution, set to a backdrop of the Cold War. But the story that it tells, and its message, is as relevant and contemporary as the playwright's Time and Setting: A small town. Summer. Not too long ago.

The story that is told in *Inherit the Wind* compels every watcher to answer the question, with so many divisive ideologies separating communities all over the nation, what will our legacy be?"
