The Game's Afoot now in rehearsals - opens Nov. 3





Volunteer Spotlight: Chuck Weed

If you've never seen Chuck on the local stage, then either you've just arrived, been in a decades long coma or aren't a true theater lover. He is one of Portland's most prolific and respected character actors, and is always a treat to watch.

A rare species, a native Oregonian, he was born in Albany. His father died in WWII before he was born, but luckily, he was indulged by loving grandparents. He spent his boyhood "riding bikes and launching matchbook rockets". His family had the first television in Albany, a gift from his grandmother in Ohio. It sat in the living room for an entire year before the first broadcast on KPTV Channel 12. They had a great watch party!

Chuck attended High School at Culver Military Academy in Indiana, where he had his first leading role in *Androcles and the Lion*. He loved how theater provied an escape from the rigid military system. After high school, he enrolled at Oregon State University, then graduated from Ohio State with a degree in Social Work. He worked briefly with troubled boys, but not finding his passion, he left and worked at his family's grocery store in Ohio.

He married and returned to Oregon. Although qualified for many career opportunities, his first love was always the theater. He is the proud father of two sons, Jason Weed, a well known local director (currently at the helm of *Misery* at *Experience Theater*), and a younger son, Josh, who attended the Air Force Academy, obtained a PhD in Economics and married the daughter of past president Reagan's Secretary of Defense. He is father to Chuck's three grandchildren and lives in Virginia.
