





Ken Ludwig's The Game's Afoot has been cast

Opens November 3 at The Rise



Over a mid-August weekend, auditions were held for *Mask & Mirror's* season opener, Ken Ludwig's *The Game's Afoot or Holmes for the Holidays*. Director Rick Hoover was delighted with just how many turned out for the auditions, but after seeing how good those auditions were, realized his job, to cast the play, had become most difficult. Good thing Rick is experienced working with exceptional actors and on

Tuesday, August 22, the cast was announced, noting "Well, that is over! I can rest again. And what a cast I have."

The action in *The Game's Afoot* takes place in December 1936, and Broadway star William Gillette, admired the world over for his leading role in the play Sherlock Holmes, has invited his fellow cast members to his Connecticut castle for a weekend of revelry. But when one of the guests is stabbed to death, the festivities in this isolated house of tricks and mirrors quickly turn dangerous. <u>Read more about the show here.</u>

Explaining his excitement in directing this show, Rick said "I have always wanted to direct a Ken Ludwig show. I found this one and immediately fell in love with the concept. I have always been a fan of Sherlock Holmes, so this was the perfect fit for me. I have also felt that William Gillette (who famously portrayed the "Master of Deduction" on stage) helped in some way to get Sherlock Holmes to the American public by creating plays and silent films about Arthur Conan Doyle's famous sleuth."

Rehearsals are underway with opening night locked in for November 3.

Yikes!


I was going to mention that I cast *The Games Afoot*, but just above this article is the story about casting *The Games Afoot*. So I won't worry about that.

Tony Broom, Director, has announced audition dates for Mask & Mirror's second show of the season, Steven Dietz' *Private Eyes*. It's also our first *Unmasked* show of the 2023 – 24 season.

Auditions are scheduled for 7pm on Sunday and Monday, October 15 and 16 at the Tualatin Heritage Center, 8700 SW

Sweek Drive in Tualatin, OR. Callbacks, if needed will be 7pm, October 19. Individuals of all levels, all experiences, and all ethnicities are invited to audition. Headshots and resumes are welcome but not required. Please bring a list of schedule conflicts. Audition pieces will be taken from the script. Rehearsals are scheduled to begin Sunday, November 19, running Sunday through Thursday, no Wednesdays. All rehearsals scheduled to take place at the Heritage Center.

Private Eyes has been described as a dark comic mystery where the audience is the detective. Playwright Dietz described it as a "relationship thriller." Things are never exactly as they appear. A director, two actors, a therapist and a mystery woman conspire to tell a story about love and infidelity while rehearsing a play. Or maybe not.



The MIGS Spotlight shines on... Robin Michaels

Is there a doctor in the house? Yes, actually, there is! Robin is a physician (now retired) who also acts and can sing like the most beautiful songbird. Such varied talents, all wrapped up in a most kind and humble human.

Born in South Bend, Indiana, where her father was a radio announcer, the family relocated to Oregon where dad got "a real job" as an executive at the Portland YMCA. At age 10,

Dad was promoted and they moved to New Jersey. It was while here that Robin was introduced to the magic of Broadway. She was treated to classics- *The Sound of Music* starring Mary Martin, *My Fair Lady*, with Julie Andrews - all the iconic shows of the era. This was where she caught the theater bug. Combined with a love of make believe and dress up, as well as piano and dance lessons, her passion was born. Additionally, her parents were active in community theater and that bore fruit when she got to play Abby in a church production of *Arsenic and Old Lace*, directed by her mother.

College was at Wooster in Ohio, where she studied vocal performance but ended up majoring in biology and pre-med. After college, it was back to Oregon for Med School at what is now OHSU. After her residency, she started singing in church choirs and a few years with the Portland Symphonic Choir. She married, had two children, Amelia (whom we all know from her stellar stage work), and Tim, an accomplished mathematician as well as a professional judge in gymnastics.

The family relocated to Tennessee, where Robin became the Medical Director of a large state facility for the developmentally disabled. While supporting Amelia's acting ambitions, she recalled how much fun she used to have onstage and became involved in the local theater scene in Knoxville.

Fast forward: divorce, retirement and successful launch of two offspring, she moved back to Oregon. It was during this time she became acquainted with her brother's best friend, Chuck Weed. Eventually they became soulmates and combined households. She got busy auditioning.

She and Chuck recently moved to *Friendsview,* a senior living community in Newberg, with their two senior dogs, Cagney and Lucy. She gets her singing fix in a community choir at George Fox. Goals include, more time with her ukulele and of course, being active in theater.

Some of Robin's favorite roles include Golde in *Fiddler on the Roof*, Mother Abbess in *The Sound of Music*, Aunt Eller in *Oklahoma*, Clairee in *Steel Magnolias*, Penny in *You Can't Take it With You* and Martha in *Arsenic and Old Lace*.

At *Mask and Mirror*, Robin is a MIG, faithful audience member and has been a frequent volunteer with house duties for several years. She is the chair of the Play Selection Committee after being a member for three years. Her one *M & M* performance was in *Motherhood Outloud*, a Zoom show during Covid. She would love to perform live on the *Mask & Mirror* stage. We'd love that also!
